Pre-Employment Transition Services provides Summer Career Exploration & Work Readiness Training to students in participating school districts in Chelan, Douglas, Grant, Adams and Okanogan counties.



WORKSITE TOURS

Individual or groups of students observe a variety of jobs performed by employees at one location.



JOB SHADOWS

Individual students visit worksites to observe a specific job based on their vocational interests.



INFORMATIONAL INTERVIEWS

Students meet 1-on-1 with employers to ask questions and learn about occupations and career paths.



WORK EXPERIENCE

Students are paid minimum wage to perform a non-permanent job (40-120 hrs) at an employer's worksite while learning the skills employers want. Placements are based on the interests and needs of the students and the needs of the worksite. SkillSource pays 100% of student wages and covers all employer liabilities including L&I. Business partners are supported by SkillSource Trainers who facilitate the work experience by conducting site visits, communicating with parents and schools and worksites.
