Service Area

SkillSource serves the North Central Workforce Development Area, which comprises Adams, Chelan, Douglas, Grant, and Okanogan counties. This makes North Central one of the largest geographic workforce areas in the state (14,612 square miles), with a combined population of just under 290,000.

The NCW region's historic economic drivers have been agriculture, forest management, fisheries, tourism, and local government. More recently, the region's hydropower and concentrated availability of high-speed fiber broadband internet hubs have resulted in significant growth in manufacturing, information technology, and renewable energy technology.



We respectfully acknowledge that we are on the traditional lands of the Wenatchi (Wenatchee), Chelan, Entiat, Methow, Okanogan, and Moses-Columbia peoples, who have been the original stewards of this region since time immemorial. We honor the sovereignty and resilience of the twelve Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation and the Confederated Tribes of the Yakama Nation, whose ancestral territories encompass much of North Central Washington.

Meeting the Need

Charlie & Samaritan Healthcare

Medical employers in Grant and Adams Counties posted 315 job openings for Registered Nurses last year, with nearly a quarter at Samaritan Healthcare. Charlie, a single mother of three, came to SkillSource seeking a new path after years in retail. With support services and financial incentives funded through State Economic Security for All (EcSA), she persevered through Big Bend Community College's rigorous nursing program.

Her persistence paid off. She graduated and secured two nursing positions—at Samaritan Hospital and as a home health nurse. These opportunities have given her family financial security and marked the beginning of a fulfilling career in healthcare.








Training Investments

SkillSource utilizes State and Federal funds to invest in people and businesses in a variety of ways that alleviate poverty and create economic viability. These amounts are for **Direct Training & Support Investments** from PY 2024–25.











Return on Investment

SkillSource is charged by Congress to achieve a measurable return on investment in human capital. Through multiple programs, \$3.75 million was invested training and supporting youth and adults to enter or reenter the workforce.

With the 312 career seekers employed now paying a combined estimated \$6.54 million of income tax on their earnings, the workforce investment is more than refunded. And since 101 of those career seekers received public assistance or unemployment payments averaging \$654 per month before training (total \$792,648 per year), there would be a federal budget savings of **\$1.32 million** after just one year of employment.

Investing in Community

Business Impact

SkillSource helps businesses grow, adapt, and strengthen their teams. Through Community Reinvestment, owners expand services, modernize equipment, and train and retain a skilled workforce.

The impact has been wide-reaching:

- 18 small businesses used investment grants to grow, train, and increase sustainability
- 90+ current employees gained certifications and new skills through incumbent worker training
- Training delivered in high-demand areas like healthcare, advanced manufacturing, and energy
- Local employers reporting stronger retention, greater efficiency, and improved bottom lines

By reinvesting in the businesses that anchor our local economy, workforce development initiatives strengthen both companies and the communities they serve —creating growth, opportunity, and stability that extend far beyond the workplace.



A New Way Forward

Darryl & The Man Shop

Darryl wasn't just looking for a job after incarceration — he wanted a fresh start. A barbering program in prison sparked his interest, and an apprenticeship at The Man Shop turned it into a profession.

With support from the Wenatchee Valley Reentry Center and SkillSource, he gained training, tools, and mentorship to launch his career. Funding through SkillSource helped cover tuition and essential barbering equipment, removing financial barriers that might have kept him on the sidelines.

"The benefit of apprenticeship is the sheer number of cuts they get to do — quantity builds skill," says Mikaila Thompson, regional manager for The Man Shops. Today, Darryl is building a stable career in a trade he's proud to call his own.

Apprenticeship Works

Mario & Genie Manufacturing

At 18, Mario Esparza was juggling school, bills, and fast food shifts when curiosity pulled him toward a Genie Manufacturing job fair table. That encounter launched him into Genie's first youth apprenticeship cohort facilitated by Advanced Manufacturing Apprenticeships (AJAC) — and onto a path that put real skills in Mario's hands, and a bright career on the horizon.

With support from SkillSource, Mario got interview coaching, work gear, and gas cards that made the leap possible. "They motivated me to finish school and helped me get on my feet," he says.

Now a Production Technician, Mario builds manifolds and preps engines, contributing to a renowned company that powers industries worldwide. The skills he gained through apprenticeship are the foundation of a stable future for him — and a source of strength for the business and the broader community.

Hands-On Learning

For SkillSource youth, the community is an extension of the classroom. Project–Based Learning brought real–world impact through hands–on projects in environmental volunteerism, support for the Special Olympics Winter Games, and putting new business administration skills to use for local non–profits.

Across Chelan–Douglas, Grant–Adams, and Okanogan, youth also stepped into 236 paid work experiences — placements that built job-readiness skills and the confidence of a first paycheck.

For young people who had stepped away from school before graduating, our Open Doors classrooms offered a way back, pairing flexible instruction with personalized support. Over 45 graduates earned diplomas, and are moving confidently into a clear career or college plan. Different routes, shared outcome: skills gained, forward momentum achieved.





Preparation + Opportunity

Danny & Central Machinery Sales

Danny first connected with SkillSource through Pre-Employment Transition Services, a program for youth with disabilities offered in partnership with local schools, DVR, and area businesses. After completing workshops and job tours, Danny interviewed at Central Machinery Sales in Moses Lake, where his enthusiasm made a strong impression.

Danny began a paid work experience in 2023 and quickly became a reliable member of the team. His supervisor, Josh Knopp, was so impressed that he promised to hire Danny once he finished high school. True to his word, Josh welcomed Danny back in 2024 as a permanent employee.

Today, Danny is thriving. He shows up on time, works hard, and takes pride in every task — from cleaning tractors to keeping the shop running smoothly. Josh says, "We will have Danny for as long as he is willing to work for us."





Collaboration

Partnerships at Work

Workforce development takes trusted partners — community agencies, schools, and businesses — coming together to address barriers and create opportunities that no single group could deliver on its own.

This year, inter-agency van tours brought insight in how partners uniquely serve communities, Business After Hours events in Wenatchee and Moses Lake opened doors for customers, partners, neighbors, and leaders to connect. Across the region, partners shared solutions at Workforce Collaboration Summits. And by partnering with organizations like CAFE and local Chambers of Commerce, we reinforced opportunities that are built by and for the communities they serve.

On The Horizon

SkillSource continues to strengthen career pathways across North Central Washington while preparing for new opportunities on the horizon.

One of the opportunities coming up is a new investment from the U.S. Department of Labor called RESET—the Re-entry, Skills, Employment, and Training Program—in Chelan and Yakima counties.

RESET will expand access to career readiness, industry training, and employment connections for individuals preparing to re-enter their communities.

This initiative builds on SkillSource's long history of supporting re-entry and reflects the broader future we see: deeper partnerships, new resources, and continued investment in people, businesses, and communities.

Resilience in motion...

The road ahead is less certain than it once seemed. Changing policies, shrinking budgets, and shifting economic currents are testing our workforce system. Yet even in this uncertainty, what endures is unmistakable: the resourcefulness of our staff, the resilience of our participants, and the strength of our partnerships.
